Jana: We flew to London and then spent two nights in Cambridge and two in Oxford. After that we made a short visit to London at the end. Both Cambridge and Oxford have an incredible mix of historical and architectural beauty which we were so excited to experience.

Anna: Well, the budget was mostly on track, although we ended up spending a bit more on food. Airbnb helped us save on accommodation, and we loved staying in local people's houses.

Jana: We travelled mostly by buses since it was the cheapest option for us. The transport between cities, was efficient and easy and in Oxford we took a double-decker bus which was fun since we don't have them in the Czech Republic.

Where and when did you speak the most English?

Anna: We spoke the most English in cafés and during guided tours in Oxford and Cambridge. We also used English at our accommodation.


Overall this whole trip was a wonderful opportunity to practise our English, understanding, listening and speaking.

Anna: Walking through the courtyards of the colleges in Oxford and imagining all the great minds that once studied there was incredible.

Jana: Same, I think this was the highlight of the trip for both of us.

## And your worst experience?

Jana: Well, our worst experience was navigating in London on the last day and trying not to get lost. It was so crowded and chaotic compared to the calm of Oxford and Cambridge. It took a bit of adjusting and we had to use online maps frequently in order to get to the right places.



### What surprised you the most about England?

Anna: We were surprised by how green and scenic the universities were. The calm, almost serene atmosphere of the college gardens in both Oxford and Cambridge felt a way different from what we expected in academic cities which are known worldwide.

#### How did you benefit from the trip, and how much did you improve your English?

Anna: I think I can speak for both of us when I say that the trip gave us an amazing opportunity to get to know British academic and cultural history better - we are so glad we had a chance to go.
